Re: Reprocessing Olympus Bronchoscopes in the Time of COVID-19

Dear Valued Olympus Customer:

This letter is in response to your inquiry regarding reprocessing Olympus bronchoscopes in the current setting of COVID-19 infections caused by the SARS-CoV-2 human coronavirus.

At the time of communication, Olympus recommends reprocessing Olympus bronchoscopes according to applicable instructions for use (IFUs) and standard practices relating to the relevant bronchoscope, automated endoscope reprocessor (AER), and any reprocessing consumable products or accessories. No additional manual cleaning or disinfecting/sterilization steps are required when reprocessing Olympus bronchoscopes that have been used on/around patients with COVID-19 or on/around patients exhibiting related clinical symptoms.

Olympus' position on this topic is consistent with current recommendations from the American Association for Bronchology and Interventional Pulmonology (AABIP)¹ and the Centers for Disease Control (CDC).²

The CDC recommends protecting healthcare personnel (including reprocessing staff) by emphasizing hand hygiene, limiting contact with patients when possible, emphasizing proper use of personal protective equipment (PPE), and implementing PPE optimization strategies, in the event applicable supplies becomes scarce.²

Finally, Olympus suggests that you work with your internal infection control personnel to address and implement any changes to your endoscopic reprocessing systems or controls.
